## 2012 Smart Start of Butler County Grants

The Smart Start and Early Childhood Block Grants have been written and submitted for 2012. These two grants provide the funding for the programs offered by Smart Start of Butler County. The purpose of these grants are to enhance early learning opportunities for children in Butler County who are birth through age 5 so that they can enter school ready to succeed.

Guidelines for the Smart Start grant required that a 14% cut be taken from the 2011 budget. The grant applications have been submitted and our agency will be notified in December if our request is approved. In an effort to meet community need, the Smart Start Advisory Committee made decisions about the 2012 request based on the outcomes of each activity from previous grant years and the community survey that was sent out over the summer of 2011.

Until we are notified that funding will be given to our program, we cannot take applications for 2012 Child Care Scholarships or Grants for Child Care Providers. During the next few weeks, Audra and the Smart Start Advisory

Committee will be examining the application process and updating applications and requirements for the scholarships and grants. When we hear from our funders that our requests were approved, we will post the 2012 applications on our website. We encourage families who are interested in applying for the 2012 Child Care Scholarship to keep an eye on the website starting in mid December. 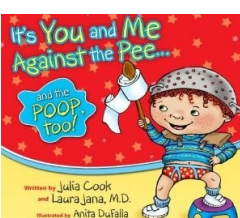

## Meet a Butler Early Childhood Professional from El Dorado

First Baptist Preschool and Child Care Center was established in 1964 and is a mission of the First Baptist Church. The center is based on a Christ centered program whose purpose is to give the best possible care and to assist parents in nurturing and education young children in all areas of their development.

They are licensed for 163 children ranging in age from 6 weeks through the 5<sup>th</sup> grade, and have 38 people on staff. Marcie McClure came to FBPCCC in February 1996 as Assistant Director and took over the title of Director in July 2000. Her greatest joy is watch the children grow in God's love. Over the years, she was instrumental in

finding funding and constructing a new playground. First Baptist Day Care has benefited from the KQRIS program for the last 4 years.

Marcie was born in El Dorado and attended elementary school until her family was transferred to north central Kansas. After she graduated from High School, she returned to El Dorado and attended BCC and then Wichita State University obtaining a Bachelors degree in Elementary Education. She has been married to Brett for 25 years and has two sons, Marshall, a freshman at BCC and a teacher in the Afterschool program at First Baptist Day Care, and Mason, a senior at El Dorado High School.

## Meet a Smart Start Advisory Committee Member

In 2010, administration of the Butler County Smart Start grant was transferred to United Way of the Plains. Community Impact Assistant, Kandi Miller, became primary contact on monthly financial grant administration duties. At that time, she began attending the Butler County Child and Family Development Task Force, and became a member of the Smart Start Advisory Committee.

Kandi grew up in Andover, KS, but attended Catholic schools in Wichita from K-12<sup>th</sup> grade, graduating from Kapaun Mt. Carmel High School. She received her Bachelor's Degree in Human Development and Family Life from The University of Kansas in 1994.

After graduation, Kandi worked for KEYS Girls' Home in Overland Park, KS as a Teaching Parent, until she decided to return to Wichita. In 1997, she earned her Master's Degree in Administration of Justice

from Wichita State University.

Kandi began as an Intensive Supervision Officer (ISO) for Sedgwick County Department of Corrections in 1998. She supervised adult, felony level offenders for over

In 2006, Kandi began working at United Way of the Plains. She assists with grant management and writing the proposals for the Butler County and Wichita Smart Start Grants, and the Wichita MSA Early Childhood Block Grant.

Her work also focuses on community initiatives surrounding persons who are experiencing homelessness, like helping with coordination of the Wichita-Sedgwick County Point-In-Time Homeless Count. Other early childhood projects that she has assisted with include Dolly Parton Imagination Library and the Raising A Reader book sharing program.
